Thank you for your letter of March 27th. We have been able to access the Cordes Society web-site, but could not bring up the roster of the Asbury Awards. We will keep trying to bring up the roster.

Robert E. Hopkins was the winner of the first award which was presented by Dr. Cordes at the April 1957 U.C. Eye residents meeting. The confusion about which year the award was first given arises because the paper was given October 25, 1956. I still have a copy of the paper entitled Tonography. Enclosed is a copy of a letter I received from Dr. Cordes just after the meeting. I had completed my residency June 30, 1956.

The name of the Society was changed 2 or 3 years later to the Frederick C. Cordes Eye Society. The recepient last year was the winner of the 50th award since for various reasons, the award was not given in 2005 or 2006. Prior to that the award was given every year since 1957.

I have not seen the plaque for many years, and would not know how accurate the records might be. I do have a complete or nearly complete list. Perhaps you could have whatever records the Department or Society has, sent to me for comparison.
